

Memorandum of Understanding

The Fresno County Rural Transit Agency (FCRTA) and the City of Firebaugh Police Department hereby agree to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the purpose of providing safety and security services for FCRTA passengers, drivers and vehicles within the City of Firebaugh. This is in compliance with direction from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) guidance on Safety and Security for Public Transit Operators.

The City of Firebaugh Police Department will provide the following services on any day during the week:

- A uniformed officer shall Board the stopped vehicle at any designated bus stop
- Make visual observations while inside vehicle
- Greet driver of vehicle
- Assist passengers or driver with any questions

FCRTA shall reimburse the City of Firebaugh Police Department for costs associated in providing these services in the amount of \$4,000.00 for the period of 7/01/15 to 6/30/16. Submit a monthly log sheet on a semi-annual basis showing the bus boarding's by date (attachment). This MOU may be renewed on an annual basis by both parties.

ORDINANCE NO. 15-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH, COUNTY OF FRESNO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 359, OF THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH, RELATING TO THE CLASSIFICATION OF THE ZONE OF PARTICULAR PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY

The City Council of the City of Firebaugh does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 25-2.1 of the Municipal Code of the City of Firebaugh is amended by changing the Zoning Map to redesignate one existing parcel currently zoned C-1 (Neighborhood Commercial) to R-3 (Medium Density Multiple Family Residential) as shown on Map 1. The subject parcel is situated on the east side of N Street (State Highway 33) approximately 2,800 feet northwest of the intersection of N Street and Clyde Fannon Road.


SECTION 2. Severability. If any part of this Ordinance is held to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, and the City Council hereby declares that it would have passed the remainder of this Ordinance, as if such invalid portion thereof had been deleted.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to certify the passage of this Ordinance and to cause the same to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation, published in the County of Fresno.

International Council of Shopping Centers (ICSC) Report

After attending the ICSC Western Conference & Deal Making convention on September 16-18. I was able to discuss with several retail, restaurant and supermarket representatives about the criteria for the City of Firebaugh to compete for these businesses. The number of City's that had a display booth was incredible. Below, you will find a summary of the city's statics presented at the conference, along with the site criteria of the restaurants I met at the conference; one company that wanted to sell their services to the City also approached me. The name of the interested company is Retail Strategies and they function as an advisory firm focused on retail market analysis, strategic planning, retail recruitment and development. The problem is the cost for a three-year commitment of \$50k in year 1 and \$30k in years two/three. This might be a good long-term objective to fund this type of research, but I do not think it is the right time due to the poor financial condition of General Fund.

RESOLUTION NO. 15-38

A RESOLUTION OF THE FIREBAUGH CITY COUNCIL ADOPTING A POLICY GOVERNING PERMIT FEE REFUNDS AND WAIVERS

The City of Firebaugh now desires to formally adopt a policy governing permit fee refunds and waivers.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOW:

- 1. Provided a written request is received by the Building Official within sixty (60) days of permit issuance, the Building Official is authorized by City of Firebaugh to refund, without interest, applicable building, plumbing, mechanical, and electrical permit fees paid for a permit under which no work is commenced and no inspection has been conducted at the time of the refund, and;
- 2. The plan review fees, if the application for which the plans were submitted is withdrawn before the plan review commences, no fee shall be refunded except on a written request by the applicant and received by the Building Official no later than sixty (60) days after payment, and;
- 3. Requests for a waiver or refunding of all other permit fees shall be made in writing to the City Council, and;
- 4. The City shall retain 20% of any fee to be refunded or \$100, whichever is less to recover its reasonable costs of administration.
