CONSULTING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH

AND

ADVANCED LIGHTING SERVICES, INC.

This Agreement is made and entered into this _____ day of August, 2018, by and between the CITY OF FIREBAUGH, a municipal corporation, hereinafter "City", and ADVANCED LIGHTING SERVICES, INC., a California corporation, hereinafter "Consultant".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, City has a requirement for consulting services in connection with the City's efforts to assess and install LED lighting on its property; and

WHEREAS, Consultant is a company consisting of persons specially trained and experienced with the business needs of the City who are willing to perform the required services.

NOW, THEREFORE, City and Consultant, for the consideration hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:

A. SERVICES BY CONSULTANT

Services to be performed by Consultant are described in Exhibit "A", which is attached and incorporated herein by this reference. A time schedule for completion shall be provided and agreed to by the City before this Agreement shall become effective.

B. COMPENSATION FOR CONSULTING SERVICES

Compensation for consulting services described in Exhibit "A" are set forth in said Exhibit.

C. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

Consultant agrees that it shall conduct its work and perform its services in compliance with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations, and any office, department or agency thereof, as well as other laws and regulations as may be applicable thereto.

D. INSURANCE

Consultant shall maintain insurance and shall submit certificates of insurance evidencing that insurance meeting the following requirements is being provided:

1. Errors and Omissions Insurance. Consultant shall have such errors and omissions insurance as shall protect City, its officers, directors, employees and agents from claims based on errors or negligent acts or omissions which may arise from Consultant's operations or performance under this Agreement, whether claims be made during or subsequent to the term of this Agreement, and whether such operations or performance be by Consultant or its employees, Consultants, agents or anyone else directly or indirectly employed by any of the foregoing. The amount of this insurance shall not be less than \$1,000,000.

Said policy shall be continued in full force and effect during the term of this Agreement. In the event of termination of said policy, new coverage shall be obtained for the required period to insure for the prior acts of Consultant during the course of performing services under the terms of this Agreement.

- 2. <u>Workers Compensation.</u> Consultant shall carry such insurance as will protect City and Consultant from claims under Workers Compensation and Employer's Liability Acts; such insurance to be maintained as to the type and amount in strict compliance with State statutes.
- 3. General Liability. Consultant shall obtain and keep in full force and effect general liability insurance including provisions for contractual liability, personal injury, independent Consultants and broad form property damage coverages. This insurance shall be on a comprehensive occurrence basis form with a stand cross liability clause or endorsement. The limit for this insurance shall be no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
- 4. <u>Automobile Liability.</u> Consultant shall maintain automobile liability insurance with coverage for any vehicle including those owned, leased, rented or borrowed. This insurance shall have a standard cross liability clause or endorsement. The limit amount for this insurance shall be no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage.
- Within thirty (30) days of the date of this Agreement, the Consultant shall provide the City with Certificates of Insurance demonstrating compliance with provisions 1 through 4 above. Said certificates shall specify or endorse to provide that ten (10) days' notice shall be given in writing to the City of any cancellations.

E. INFORMATION FURNISHED BY CITY

Consistent with the professional standard of care and unless specifically provided herein, Consultant shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy of data and information provided by City or others without independent review or evaluation.

F. INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS

- 1. Consultant shall protect, indemnify, hold harmless and defend City, its directors, officers, employees and agents, from any and all claims, fines, demands, costs, expenses (including but not limited to attorney fees and costs of litigation or arbitration), liability, losses, penalties, causes of action, awards, suits or judgments for damages of any nature whatsoever (hereinafter collectively referred to as Claims) to the extent arising out of the breach of this Agreement in whole or in part by willful or fraudulent misconduct or negligent acts, by Consultant, its employees, agents or Consultants, or the agent, employee or Consultant of any one of them in the performance of their duties or in their operations under this Agreement.
- 2. City shall protect, indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Consultant, its officers, directors, employees and subcontractors from any and all claims, fines, costs, demands, expenses (including but not limited to attorney fees and costs of litigation or arbitration), liability, losses, penalties, causes of action, awards, suite or judgments for damages of any nature whatsoever (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Claims") to the extent arising out of the breach of this Agreement in whole or in party by willful or fraudulent misconduct or negligent acts, by City, its employees, agents or Consultants, or the agent, employee or Consultant of any one of them in the performance of their duties or in the operations under this Agreement.

- 3. Neither termination of this Agreement nor completion of the acts to be performed under this Agreement shall release either party from its obligations to indemnify as to any Claims so long as the event upon which such Claims is predicted shall have occurred prior to the effective date of any such termination or completion and arose out of or was in any way connected with performance or operations under this Agreement by either party, its employees, agents or Consultants, or the employee, agent or Consultant of any one of them.
- 4. Submission of insurance certificates or other proof of compliance with the insurance requirements in this Agreement does not relieve Consultant from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. The obligation of this indemnity article shall apply whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any of such damages or claims for damages.

G. RECORDS OF CONSULTANT

Records of Consultant's direct personnel pertaining to the service hereunder shall be kept on a generally-recognized accounting basis, and shall be available for inspection by City or its designees at reasonable times.

H. TERMINATION

City may terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to Consultant if Consultant breaches any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

I. ASSIGNMENT

Consultant shall not assign this Agreement, nor any part thereof, nor any monies due hereunder, without the prior written consent of City.

J. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS, APPLICATIONS AND DATA

Originals of all applications, documents and data prepared by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall be and remain the property of City.

K. NON-DISCRIMINATION

In connection with the performance of Consultant pursuant to this Agreement, Consultant will not willfully discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, ancestry, or national origin. Consultant will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, ancestry or national origin. Such action shall include, but not limited to, the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

L. NOTICES

All notices, statements, reports, approvals, or requests or other communications, that are required either expressly, or by implication, to be given by either party to the other under this Agreement shall be in writing and signed for each party by such officers as each may, from time to time, authorize in writing to so act. All such notices shall be deemed to have been received on the date of delivery if delivered personally or three (3) days after mailing if enclosed in a properly addressed and stamped envelope and deposited in the U.S. Post Office for delivery. Unless, and until formally notified otherwise, all notices shall be addressed to the parties at their address shown:

M. ATTORNEY FEES

In the event of any arbitration, litigation, or other action or proceeding of any nature, between City and Consultant becomes necessary to enforce or interpret all or any portion of this Agreement, or because of an alleged breach by either party of any of the terms hereof, it is mutually agreed that the losing or defaulting party shall pay the prevailing party reasonable attorney fees, costs and expenses incurred in connection with the prosecution or defense of such action or proceeding. Venue shall be in Fresno County, California, and California Law shall be applicable.

N. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This writing constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties relative to the services specified herein, and no modifications hereof shall be effective unless and until such modification is evidenced by a writing signed by both parties to this Agreement. There are no understandings, agreements, conditions, representations, warranties or promises with respect to this Agreement except those contained or referenced to in this writing.

O. AGENT OF CITY

In performing the services required under this Agreement, Consultant is acting as an agent of City, subject to the general supervision and control of its governing body. As such, Consultant shall be entitled to the same immunities and protections as any other governmental employee exercising discretion under all applicable statutes, regulations, and judicial and administrative precedent, subject to City's rights of action against Consultant for any professional errors or omissions of Consultant. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Consultant shall not be entitled to receive any employee benefits as it remains an independent contractor during the term of this Agreement.

P. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall be severable and not affected thereby.

O. WAIVER OF RIGHTS

Any waiver at any time by either party hereto of its rights with respect to a breach or default, or any other matter arising in connection with this Agreement, shall not be deemed to be a waiver with respect to any other breach, default or matter.

R. REMEDIES NOT EXCLUSIVE

The use by either party of any remedy specified herein for the enforcement of this Agreement is not exclusive and shall not deprive the party using such remedy of, or limit the application of any remedy provided by law.









BACKGROUND:

The Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) is pleased to announce the release of this Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for approximately \$72 million in funds for the Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME). These funds include approximately \$29 million in allocated 2017 HOME federal funds and \$43 million in estimated 2018 HOME federal funds. HCD will release a NOFA amendment if there is a substantial difference in HCD's 2018 federal HOME allocation.

This NOFA is subject to state and federal HOME regulations. State recipients, as defined by state HOME regulations section 8201(ii), and nonprofit community housing development organizations (CHDOs), are eligible to apply for HOME funding for rental projects, first-time homebuyer (FTHB) projects, and program activities. Developers, including Native American Entities, can apply directly for HOME funding for rental projects and FTHB projects. This NOFA makes funding available to eligible HOME applicants serving low- (at or below 80 percent of the area median income (AMI)) and very low-income (at or below 50 percent of AMI) households.

Eligible Activities:

- 1. Rental projects
- 2. FTHB projects
- 3. Program activities

Eligible HOME Program activities are as follows:

- a) First Time Homebuyer (FTHB) program
- b) Owner-occupied rehabilitation (OOR) program
- c) Tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA) program

Proposed Application:

Staff is recommending an application for \$500,000 to fund a First Time Homebuyer (FTHB) Program and Owner Occupied Rehabilitation (OOR) Program. The City last had a FTHB/OOR program in 2011.

The FTHB program offers financial assistance to low income buyers looking to purchase their first home. The City's assistance comes in the form of a "silent second loan" meant to fund the gap between the purchase price of the home and what the buyer is able to borrower from a primary loan. For instance, if any applicant was pre-approved from a lender for \$150,000 and found a home for \$200,000, the City could potentially fund the \$50,000 gap. Because payments are deferred on the City loan, the borrower only needs to make payments on the primary loan, thus making the purchase more "affordable". The City loans these funds out at 2% interest for a term of 45 years. Should the borrower sell or transfer title, the loan becomes due in full.

The OOR program offers financial assistance to low income homeowners who are looking to address health and safety issues within their home. Because the program is a loan, the homeowner must have equity in their property. The City offers these funds as a deferred loan payment at 2% interest for a term of 15 years.

Authorize staff to move forward with submitting an application to HCD by August 23, 2018 and execute attached resolution.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH HEREBY AUTHORIZES THE SUBMITTAL OF AN APPLICATION TO THE CALIFORNIA STATE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOR FUNDING UNDER THE HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM; AND IF SELECTED, THE EXECUTION OF A STANDARD AGREEMENT, ANY AMENDMENTS THERETO, AND OF ANY RELATED DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM

WHEREAS:

- A. The California Department of Housing and Community Development (the "Department") is authorized to allocate HOME Investment Partnerships Program ("HOME") funds made available from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD"). HOME funds are to be used for the purposes set forth in Title II of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, in federal implementing regulations set forth in Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations, part 92, and in Title 25 of the California Code of Regulations commencing with section 8200.
- B. On <u>June 5, 2018</u>, the Department issued a Notice of Funding Availability announcing the availability of funds under the HOME program (the "NOFA").
- C. In response to the June 2018 HOME NOFA, the <u>City of Firebaugh</u>, a municipal corporation, (the "Applicant"), wishes to apply to the Department for, and receive an allocation of, HOME funds.

IT IS NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT:

1. In response to the June 2018 HOME NOFA, the Applicant shall submit an application to the Department to participate in the HOME program and for an allocation of funds not to exceed <u>Five Hundred Thousand Dollars</u> (\$500,000) for the following activities and/or programs:

First Time Homebuyer Program & Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation Program

to be located in within the City limits of Firebaugh.

- 2. If the application for funding is approved, then the Applicant hereby agrees to use the HOME funds for eligible activities in the manner presented in its application as approved by the Department in accordance with the statutes and regulations cited above. The Applicant may also execute a standard agreement, any amendments thereto, and any and all other documents or instruments necessary or required by the Department or HUD for participation in the HOME program (collectively, the required documents).
- 3. The applicant authorizes the <u>City Manager</u> or his/her designee(s) to execute, in the name of the applicant, the required documents.
