Founded in 1914

Incorporated in 1914, the city of Firebaugh is a small community located along the San Joaquin River in Fresno County. Before the railroad, the San Joaquin River was the major thoroughfare to upstream communities. Ferries were the only way to cross the river until the late 1800's, when the first bridges were built. The San Joaquin River having played a major role in the settling of the valley, Firebaugh is one of the oldest historical towns on the Westside. The ferry, located in Firebaugh, was the major crossing for prospectors heading for gold country.

Firebaugh is located approximately 43 miles west of the city of Fresno and 17 miles east of Interstate 5, the main north-south link between San Francisco and Los Angeles. The City owns and operates an airport, providing an additional mode of transport for its residents and businesses. Prospective businesses can take advantage of numerous hiring and development incentives when establishing their facilities within the city. Affordable housing, excellent schools, a mild climate, varied recreational activities, and a strong sense of community make Firebaugh a great place to live.



Educational Attainment (2012) Population 25+






