4. THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH TO DISCUSS HIGHWAY 33 BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT.

It was reported CalTrans stated they have too many projects with a short time frame & can't complete all of them by the deadline. City Manager Gallegos offered to do some of the work, as a solution to the time frame issue, but was informed city must purchase the right-of-way to be able to any work there. If the City purchases the property to do the work, but doesn't completion the project by the deadline, the city will not be reimbursed. The city may only get reimbursed if the deadline is met. Therefore, the recommendation is to not proceed with assisting CalTrans on projects. We have been working on this project for about 10 years, and all of Caltrans districts seem to operate the same.

Council direction is to meet with Senator Caballero and Assemblyman Arambula to seek support with Caltrans.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Esmeralda Murillo – A car was racing; police chased the car, so the car hit the speed bump, lost control & crashed. I would like more speed bumps, so that is the reason for me attending this meeting, to suggest more speed bumps. Usually, it the kids getting out of school that are racing, & there are potholes in front of Mark Helm's houses. Another resident reported similar incidents at Indart Street, & asked is possible to add speed bumps there, there has been incidents when cars have ended up in at least at three different homes. A different resident stated he's requested speed bumps in past but was informed that it makes it difficult for emergency vehicles to respond to emergencies, a child even lost their life due to the dely. Police Chief Raygoza recommend, citizens' get a license plate number, but must be willing to sign the citation to testify as a witness to the incidents, for the police to issue a citation to individuals that are racing.

PUBLIC COMMENT

NEW BUSINESS

1. FIREBAUGH LAS DELTAS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT UPDATES.

Dr. Roy Mendiola, Superintendent shared his appreciation for the support from the City and especially the Firebaugh Police Department with the recent need for their presence for the safety of our students and staff. We recently had some break-ins that ended with a couple arrests; along with some individuals coming through tour community hat are not residents. The district wants to provide our PD partners with more resources along with access to our sites which will provide a safer environment for staff and students.

Dr. Mendiola shared information on the upcoming projects that will be taking place in the district the next several months. At Mills we will be adding 3 additional classrooms along with a couple relocatable buildings that are being donated to the District from West Hills College. These two relocatable buildings will not be used for classrooms but for offices for Mills administration and support staff. The Firebaugh Middle School will be painted, and the project will begin over spring break and will be finished over the summer. The Bailey Kitchen and Multi-Purpose room will receive

a make-over during the summer. At Firebaugh High School we will be removing two relocatable classrooms and replacing them with two permanent stick buildings that will house 2 classrooms and 4 offices. The Auto Shop at Firebaugh High School will be remodeled over the summer as well. We are working on replacing our district intercom system; install vape detection devices and adding more cameras to sites. All these are for the safety of students and staff. We are looking at go-green projects, with some of the items being electric buses, charging stations, plumbing upgrades, etc. We are looking for funding for a new aquatic center and will be asking the city for support. If no funding is found, we may consider a Bond in the future.

Dr. Mendiola noted that he has talked to the City about their current facility where city hall is located. Once the city buildings are vacated.

Dr. Mendiola discussed the current mask mandate which is required for all students and staff. He noted that the Governor is scheduled to make an announcement on Monday, February 28th with regards to masking guidelines for schools. It is likely that the new change will allow mask wearing to be optional. The new language might state that masks are strongly recommended, but no longer required for anyone indoors.

Our District has been conducting in-person Board meetings and will continue to do so. We are proud that we have been able to keep our students in school, participating in athletics and extra-curricular activities. This is what is best for our students, and we have been able to do this with the support of our Board and staff as we had testing protocols in place and were able to keep our doors open and activities moving forward. We are seeing the positivity rate start to drop. We will be conducting in-person graduation this year. We will continue to do what is best for our students and staff, as this is our number one priority. There are two new banks of COVID leave for staff; one is for 5 days for any staff who has tested positive for COVID-19; the second bank is for staff caring for a family member who is COVID positive or for someone who receives the vaccine and has a reaction. Both of these are retroactive to January 1, 2022.

City Manager Ben Gallegos shared that the City is also looking for grants for the aquatic Center. He shared that there are grants for Parks; he noted that there are a lot of grants out there and they are trying to go after all that they can. He will invite our elected officials to look at our pool and parks and encourage them to support the City and District on securing monies for our needs. He thanked the district for bringing the Food Distribution to our community, it is another great resource for our families.

Trustee Eliseo Gamino shared that he is glad to see the City and District working together. We need our police to help us educate our kids on their mistakes. Our kids had too much time on their hands during the pandemic and may have not made good decisions during that time and will need some help to turn themselves around. Dr. Mendiola shared that the district has brought back the All-4 Youth program as well as Prodigy which not only is available to help our students but also their families

2. CITY OF FIREBAUGH UPDATES.

City Manager Ben Gallegos shared information on the upcoming projects that will be taking place within the City. There will be alleys paved behind Don Pepe's, by the US Post Office, and the New Fire Station. There will be street paving work on 14th, J Street, and 10th Streets. The new Fire Department was supposed to be completed by March, but it won't be finished until December. The Electric Panel is holding up the completion and occupancy. 3. EXPLORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR COLLABORATION AND PARTNERSHIP.

Councilman Freddy Valdez shared that he would like for the Board to allow Dr. Mendiola and possibly a Board member to attend the Legislative Action Day in April to collaborate with our legislative representatives. Attending this with our Council members would show them the legislators the collaboration that we have developed. Dr. Mendiola shared that he would like to have a timeline on projects. He is excited with the relationship being built between the District, City and Police Department. He said he looks forward to working with everyone to align our growth with the City growth so we can stay ahead of it. He hopes we can continue to work on a resolution for the Mills intersection.

Councilman Freddy Valdez shared that Mr. Rangel with the Department of Homeland Security is willing to come and review our community and schools and to share his thoughts on security. He also hopes that everyone will utilize the new city text for communication. If you see something, send a message back to the city or better yet, send a picture and let us know what it is that you see and where it is. Freddy also shared that there are Micro grants available for small businesses and hopes that our community will take advantage of them. Board President Ronald Parker noted that at our next meeting we should include West Hills College on the agenda so we can collaborate with them as well. Bethany Matos, Dean of the North District Center was in attendance and shared she would be happy to be a part of our meetings.

4. VIRTUAL OPTION FOR JOINT MEETINGS.

Dr. Roy Mendiola Superintendent noted that the District is committed to in-person meetings and when we host the meeting they will be in-person. If the City wants to hold virtual joint meetings, he invites them to host the meeting. Council member Freddy Valdez shared that he wanted to do a hybrid model as he sees the opportunity for those who aren't comfortable or able to attend in-person meetings the option to attend. Elsa Lopez, Council woman shared that she agrees with in-person meetings and wished the City would do the same thing.

5. PUBLIC COMMENTS.

Mayor Brady Jenkins said it has been great working with the school and then working with the police department as a school employee. Trustee Abel Serrano stated that this is a beautiful partnership that has been developed. We are all here for the same reasons our students and community and we need to work together. We want our kids to appreciate

and respect our officers and are glad they are making their appearance on our campuses. Chief Raygoza thanked Dr. Mendiola and the administration for allowing his officers to go onto the schools and talk to the students. He has encouraged his officers to make their selves visible. A parent in the audience asked if there are workshops for parents to learn about drugs and things to look for with their children. She feels there needs to be more things for our kids to do in our community. She would like to see group meetings held for parents. Dr. Mendiola shared that we have not had a good turnout at our group meetings especially during the pandemic, but we do have Migrant, Special Education, Community and Site Parent meetings. Dr. Mendiola shared that any parent can ask for a meeting to discuss a specific topic; once that has been done, they would discuss with the administration at the district level, and we could move forward from there. He also shared that we have the After School Program, Athletics, Music, Youth Empowerment, Mariachi's will soon be an extra-curricular option for our students. Trustee Fernando Campa noted that the Police Activities League offers softball, soccer, an Explorer Program and Fire Cadet Program. Freddy Valdez shared that at our Migrant Mini Conference we have had topics on Drugs, Immigration, and other topics of interest. Ben Gallegos shared that there is a group of parents that meet every Wednesday at the Community Center at 6:00 pm that she may want to participate in. Chief Raygoza noted that he has a grant officer that is working to meeting with parents and students to educate them on topics of smoking, drugs, etc.

6. BOARD MEMBER and CITY COUNCIL MEMBER COMMENTS.

Trustee Eliseo Gamino thanked the city for their leadership roles, as well as West Hills College for their support of our dual enrollment program. Amanda Fleming shared that the quality of life is important, Clovis dropped their mask mandate. She said what is concerning her are the clinics that the city and school district are offering. She would like us to pull back and not offer the vaccination clinics to our community. Dr. Mendiola stated that the clinics are optional; and masks may become optional as well. Amanda asked if the City and District are required to hold vaccination clinics. Trustee Abel Serrano noted that the clinics are optional, and we are not required to have them, but we want to offer this resource for our families and community members that want it. No one is forced to go and get the vaccination. Freddy Valdez noted that we have a community of 8,300 people and we need to represent and offer what we can to our community, it is their choice to take advantage of it, but they are not forced. Anthony Catalan, FHS Principal thanked the Chief of Police and his officers for all the things that they do that people don't see or hear about. These past two weeks were rough ones at the high school and his officers came in and did an amazing job. Mr. Catalan also shared with the parent requesting meetings that he will let her know when he continues with his meetings, and he invited her to attend. He said he covers a variety of topics and has had good feedback from those who attend. Manuel Perez, Director of Technology shared that we need to have a cyber bullying presentation for parents, this is an area that parents need to be made aware of and the trouble that it can and has caused. Trustee Fernando Campa noted that it is a pleasure to have these meetings; he knows that for everyone here the quality of life is a goal for us. We don't always know what is going on in the background, and we only hear the negative. He thanked everyone for attending. Council woman Elsa Lopez asked if the district has thought about adjusting their employee's salary since the cost of living is so high? Dr. Mendiola said the district has discussed salaries and has the desire to be competitive. We are fortunate that we have administrators that are Firebaugh alumni and, also, have hired many teachers this year who are also alumni. Freddy Valdez spoke as President of the CSEA that this has been discussed for several years now and we knew it was going to have to be addressed. Dr. Mendiola shared that we can only compensate our staff so much and we are looking at an increase to get to the median, but it may take 2-3 years to do this. Our staff know what the district has in mind, and we don't want our salaries at the bottom, but we also know that we can't be at the very top, but we will work to be somewhere in the median range. Our teachers seem to understand where the district is headed and seem to be supportive of what we are doing. City Manager Ben Gallegos noted that he has lived in the city and went through our school system, and he is the first city manager to do so. He also stated as a parent of students currently in the system thanked the district for offering our kids opportunities that some students in larger districts may never have. President Ronald Parker thanked everyone for attending and their comments this evening. He stated we are one district and one community. He also said that by working with the city we will continue to improve the quality of life for residents together.

7. ADJOURNMENT

Motion adjourned by Abel Serrano, seconded by Fernando Campa; Motion was carried unanimously at 8:13 p.m.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-20

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH AUTHORIZING USE OF EMERGENCY REMOTE TELECONFERENCING PROVISIONS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Firebaugh ("City Council") is committed to open and transparent government, and full compliance with the Ralph M. Brown Act ("Brown Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act generally requires that a public agency take certain actions in order to use teleconferencing to attend a public meeting virtually; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that a local emergency persists due to the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the California Legislature has recognized the ongoing state of emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic and has responded by creating an additional means for public meetings to be held via teleconference (inclusive of internet-based virtual meetings); and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2021, the California legislature passed Assembly Bill ("AB") 361, which amends Government Code, section 54953 and permits a local agency to use teleconferencing to conduct its meetings in any of the following circumstances: (A) the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency, and state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; (B) the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or (C) the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and has determined, by majority vote, pursuant to subparagraph (B), that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, in order for the City Council to use teleconferencing as allowed by AB 361 after October 1, 2021, it must first adopt findings in a Resolution, allowing the City Council to conduct teleconferenced meetings for a period of thirty (30) days; and

WHEREAS, if the state of emergency remains active, or state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, in order to continue to teleconference under 361, the City Council shall make findings in a Resolution every thirty (30) days regarding the current state of the emergency.

WHEREAS, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency for the State of California due to the COVID-19 pandemic in his order entitled "Proclamation of a State of Emergency," signed March 4, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the California Occupational and Safety Health Administration (CalOSHA) continues to recommend certain social distancing requirements, as described in detail in California Code of Regulations Title 8, section 3205 Covid Prevention; and

WHEREAS, on October 4, 2021, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 21-42 that found that the state and local emergencies have caused and will continue to cause imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2022, the City Council last renewed the required AB 361 findings; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution is being brought at the next regular City Council meeting and is substantially compliant with the required renewed findings timeline under AB 361.

WHEREAS, the City Council is conducting its meetings through the use of telephonic and internet-based services so that members of the public may observe and participate in meetings and offer public comment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Firebaugh as follows:

- 1. The City Council is conducting meetings during a state of emergency.
- 2. CalOSHA recommends measures to promote social distancing.
- 3. The City Council has determined that given the state of emergency, holding in-person only meetings would present imminent risks to the health or safety of members and attendees.
- 4. The actions taken by the City Council through this Resolution may be applied to all City Boards and committees governed by the Brown Act unless otherwise desired by that Body.
- 5. The City Council authorizes the City Manager or their designee(s) to take all actions necessary to conduct City Council meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and all other applicable provisions of the Brown Act, using teleconferencing for a period of thirty (30) days from the adoption of this Resolution after which the City Council will reconsider the circumstances of the state of emergency.
- 6. Staff is directed to return no later than thirty (30) days after the adoption of this Resolution with an item for the Council to consider making the findings required by AB 361 in order to continue meeting under its provisions.

The foregoing resolution is effective upon adoption and was approved and adopted at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Firebaugh held on the 16th day of May 2022, by the following vote:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN SAID CITY ON TUESDAY NOVEMBER 8, 2022, FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS OF SAID CITY AND REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FRESNO TO CONSOLIDATE AND CANVASS THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022 WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THAT DATE PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA ELECTIONS CODE SECTION 10400 ET SEQ.; TO PERMIT THE COUNTY CLERK/REGISTRAR OF VOTERS OF THE COUNTY OF FRESNO TO RENDER SPECIFIED SERVICES TO THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH, RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF SAID GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA ELECTIONS CODE SECTION 10002; AND AUTHORIZING REIMBURSEMENT FUNDS TO PAY FOR SAID SERVICES

WHEREAS, the next Statewide General Election to be held in the County of Fresno will take place on November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City of *Firebaugh*, intends to call and order a General Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, for the election of (2) Council Members, City Clerk, and City Treasure; each for a 4-year term; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of Firebaugh to adopt a Resolution requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fresno to consolidate said election with the Statewide General Election pursuant to Part 3 of Division 10 of the Elections Code of the State of California (commencing with Section 10400) to be held on the same date and that, within the City of Firebaugh, the precincts, vote center locations, ballot drop box locations, and election officers of the two (2) elections be the same; the County Clerk/Registrar of Voters canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election; and the election be held in all respects as if there were only one (1) election; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of Firebaugh to adopt a Resolution requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fresno to render specified services to the City of Firebaugh relating to the conduct of a General Municipal Election pursuant to Section 10002 of the Elections Code of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, Section 10002 of the Elections Code of the State of California requires the City of Firebaugh to reimburse the County of Fresno in full for the services performed upon presentation of a bill to the City of Firebaugh; and

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Firebaugh has determined that each candidate for elective office who submits a statement to be sent to the voters with the sample ballot shall be charged a sum not greater than the actual prorated cost of printing, handling, and translating the candidate's statement, if any incurred by the agency as a result of providing this service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIREBAUGH as follows:

SECTION 1. A General Municipal Election is called and ordered for the City of Firebaugh to be held on November 8, 2022, for the purpose of the election of (2) Council Members, City Clerk, and City Treasure of the City Council to represent the City of Firebaugh each for a 4-year term.

SECTION 2. Pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code of the State of California, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fresno is hereby requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of the General Municipal Election and the Statewide General Election on November 8, 2022.

SECTION 3. In accordance with the provisions of Section 10403 of the Elections Code of the State of California, the City Council of the City of Firebaugh acknowledges that the consolidated election will be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of law regulating the Statewide General Election pursuant to Section 10418 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

SECTION 4. The Board of Supervisors of the County of Fresno is requested to direct the County Clerk/Registrar of Voters to take any and all steps necessary for and related to the holding of the consolidated election in a manner consistent with law, including, without limitation: the provision of all election materials and equipment; publication of notices; the hiring, training and supervision of election officers and other election personnel; the printing and distribution of ballot materials; the translation of ballot materials; the collection of submitted ballots; the tallying and canvassing of votes; and the certification of election results.

SECTION 5. Pursuant to Section 10002 of the Elections Code of the State of California, the City Council of the City of Firebaugh authorizes reimbursement to the County of Fresno in full for the services to be performed as herein requested and that said sum be paid to the County of Fresno upon demand and presentation of a bill to the City of Firebaugh.

SECTION 6. The candidate shall, if he/she elects to submit a statement, of no more than 200 words, to be included with the sample ballot and sent to the registered voters, pay all costs associated with said election statement; Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 13307, the candidate is required to make an estimated pre-payment to the County at the time the candidate files the nomination papers.

RECOMMMENDATION:

1. City Council adopts a resolution declaring the City's intention to levy and collect the Annual Assessments for Assessment District No. 1

2. Set a date, time and place to hold a public hearing to hear public testimony regarding the assessments.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

Each year, the City levies annual assessments within its Landscaping, Lighting and Maintenance District (LLMD). On April 04, 2022, Council initiated proceedings for the annual levy and the City Engineer was directed to prepare the Engineer's Report for the annual assessment.

The yearly assessments established for all properties within the District cover the City's cost for maintenance, related services, and incidental expenses. The assessments for District No. 1 (excluding Tract 5529, 6257, 6313, 6314, & 6252) are unchanged from last year; this assessment district was created utilizing a fixed assessment of \$35.00 per residential unit (RU). The total calculated amount to be assessed for District No. 1 (excluding Tract 5529, 6257, 6313, 6314, & 6252) for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$17,296.00 based on \$35.00 multiplied by 494.17 RU (total assessable units).

The assessments for Tract 5529 are subject to an annual adjustment tied to the Consumer Price Index.

The maximum allowable assessment increase is equal to the change in CPI and shall not exceed 3.0%. Since the change in the CPI was 3.2%, the increase in assessment is limited to 3.0%. In accordance with the foregoing limitations, the assessment for 2022-2023 will be \$118.34 per RU. The total calculated amount for Tract 5529 to be assessed for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$22,010.48 divided by 186 RU.2

The assessments for Tract 6257, 6313, & 6314 are subject to an annual adjustment tied to the Consumer Price Index.

The maximum allowable assessment increase is equal to the change in CPI and shall not exceed 3.0%. Since the change in the CPI was 3.2%, the increase in assessment is limited to 3.0%. In accordance with the foregoing limitations, the assessment for 2022-2023 will be \$84.30 per RU. The total calculated amount for Tract 6257, 6313, & 6314 to be assessed for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$11,043.30 divided by 131 RU.

The assessments for Tract 6252, and Outlot "A" (Del Rio Place Apartments), are subject to an annual adjustment tied to the Consumer Price Index.

The maximum allowable assessment increase is equal to the change in CPI and shall not exceed 3.0%. Since the change in the CPI was 3.2%, the increase in assessment is limited to 3.0%. In accordance with the foregoing limitations, the assessment for 2022-2023 will be \$145.28 per RU. The total calculated amount for Tract 6252, and Outlot "A" (Del Rio Place Apartments) to be assessed for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$12,929.92 divided by 89 RU.

The Engineer's Report, Resolution of Intention, and public hearing are requirements set forth in Division 15, part 2, of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California.

Two meetings are required to complete the annual assessment process. As required by the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, the preliminary Engineer's Report for Assessment District No. 1 is on file with the City Clerk and is available for public review. At this regular meeting on May 16, 2022, the City Council will review the draft annual Engineer's Report detailing the assessments, and consider the attached resolution declaring the City's intention to levy and collect the annual assessments. The attached resolution sets a public hearing on the proposed levy for June 20, 2022 at which time any interested person has the right to be heard either orally or in writing before the completion of the hearing. The public hearing will serve as the second required meeting, and staff will seek Council's formal adoption of the annual Engineer's Report at that time.

FISCAL IMPACT:

It is anticipated the City will collect approximately \$63,279.70 from the City of Firebaugh Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District No. 1 and Tract 5529, 6257, 6313, & 6314, Tract 6252, and Outlot "A" (Del Rio Place Apartments) Assessments to cover estimated maintenance, utility and administration expenses for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS

The plans and specifications for the street landscaping and lighting and storm drainage improvements to be maintained are on file at the Public Works Department of the City of Firebaugh and are incorporated herein by reference.

DISTRICT FORMATION

WHEREAS, on October 1, 1990, the City Council of the City of Firebaugh directed inclusion of the storm drainage basin serving Tracts 4010 and 4060 in the landscaping and lighting maintenance district to provide funding to finance the improvement of said storm drainage basin and its maintenance; and

WHEREAS, on December 5, 1991, the Planning Commission of the City of Firebaugh approved the Tentative Subdivision Map of Tract 4608, in the City of Firebaugh, County of Fresno, State of California, subject to the terms of the "Conditions of Approval," which provided for the annexation to the existing landscaping and lighting maintenance district to provide funds to the City for the maintenance of the public lighting within street rights-of-way and landscaping within a landscaping easement included as a part of said district; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2001, the City Council of the City of Firebaugh ordered annexation and inclusion of Phases II and III of Tract 4851 (Cerca Del Rio II), for the maintenance of the public lighting and other improvements within street rights-of-way and for storm drain purposes, in the landscaping and lighting district to provide funding for such improvements and their maintenance; and

PART D

METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT OF ASSESSMENT

LANDSCAPING AND LIGHTING MAINTENANCE DISTRICT NO. 1

(Pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972)

Method of Assessment Spread

The basic objective of the Assessment Spread is to distribute costs in accordance with the benefits received. Costs are to be spread equally to each residential unit (RU) as follows:

- (a) For 2022-2023, Tracts 4010, 4060, 4459, 4608, 4850, 5202, 5367, 4851 Phases I, II, III, Parcel "A", Parcel "B" and Hacienda Villa Apartments have been completed and accepted by the City. The combined tracts consist of 390 lots or parcels. Each single-family residential lot is considered an assessable unit. The total square footage of each multi-residential lot is divided by 6,000 square feet to determine the number of assessable units for each multi-residential lot. There is a total of 387 single-family RU lots and 3 multi-residential lots consisting of 107.17 RU lots for a total of 494.17 RU assessable units, each of which benefit equally from the improvements maintained by this landscaping and lighting maintenance district.
- (b) For 2022-2023, Tract 5529 has been completed and accepted by the City. The total number of RU lots in this subdivision is 186, each of which benefit equally from the improvements maintained by this landscaping and lighting maintenance district.
- (c) For 2022-2023, Tract 6257, 6313, & 6314 have been completed and accepted by the City. The total number of RU lots in this subdivision is 131, each of which benefit equally from the improvements maintained by this landscaping and lighting maintenance district.
- (d) For 2022-2023, Tract 6252, Outlot "A" (Del Rio Place Apartments), and Outlot "B" have been completed and accepted by the City. Tract 6252 consists of 33 single family residental lots and Outlot "A" consists of 56 Muti-family units. The total number of RU lots in this subdivision is 89, each of which benefit equally from the improvements maintained by this landscaping and lighting maintenance district.

Computing Individual Assessment

- (a) The total number of assessable units is 494.17 RU. The assessment will be \$35.00 per RU for 2022-2023 due to the limitations of assessments below. The total calculated amount to be assessed for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$17,296.00 based on \$35.00 multiplied by 494.17. This sentence does not apply to Tract 5529, 6257, 6313, 6314, & 6252.
- (b) Tract 5529 The total number of assessable units is 186 RU. The total estimated cost to be assessed for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$22,167.00. The maximum allowable assessment increase is equal to the change in CPI and shall not exceed 3.0%. The change in the CPI for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 was 3.2%. Consecquently, the total assessable cost of \$22,167.00 will not be fully recovered through the FY 2022/2023 assessment since the maximum assessable amount is limited to the FY 2020/2021 assessment escalated by 3.0%, or \$21,369.40 x 0.03, equaling \$22,010.48. The assessment will be \$118.34 per RU for 2022-2023. This applies only to Tract 5529.
- (c) Tract 6257, 6313, & 6314 \$11,044.56. The total number of assessable units is 131 RU. The total estimated cost to be assessed for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$11,044.56. The maximum allowable assessment increase is equal to the change in CPI and shall not exceed 3.0%. The change in the CPI for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 was 3.2%. Consecquently, the total assessable cost of \$11,044.56 will be fully recovered through the FY 2022/2023 assessment since the maximum assessable amount is limited to the FY 2020/2021

assessment escalated by 3.0%, or $10,722.88 \times 0.03$, equaling 11,044.56. The assessment will be 4.30 per RU for 2022-2023. This applies only to Tract 6257, 6313, 4.6314.

(d) Tract 6252 - The total number of assessable units is 89 RU. The total estimated cost to be assessed for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$12,931.36 The maximum allowable assessment increase is equal to the change in CPI and shall not exceed 3.0%. The change in the CPI for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 was 3.2%. Consecquently, the total assessable cost of \$12,931.36 will be fully recovered through the FY 2022/2023 assessment since the maximum assessable amount is limited to the FY 2020/2021 assessment escalated by 3.0%, or \$12,554.72 x 0.03, equaling \$12,931.36. The assessment will be \$145.28* per RU for 2022-2023. This applies only to Tract 6252.

* Amount was rounded down one cent to conform to County Auditor requirements that the amount to be billed to the taxpayer must be an even amount (divisible by 2).

Limitations on Assessments

- (a) Normally, the assessable costs may be revised upon preparation of the Engineer's Report for each fiscal year for which assessments are to be levied and collected as provided for in the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 (State Streets and Highways Code Section 22500) and Division 15 Part 2 as amended per Proposition 218; however, this assessment district was created utilizing a fixed assessment of \$35.00 per assessable unit. This sentence does not apply to Tract 5529.
- (b) This Subsection (b) only applies to Tract 5529. Assessments in each successive year are subject to an annual adjustment tied to the Consumer Price Index-U for the San Francisco Bay Area as of December of each succeeding year (the "CPI"), with a maximum annual CPI adjustment not to exceed 3%. The calculation of the change in the CPI shall use December 2006 as the base year CPI. In the event that the annual change in the CPI exceeds 3%, any percentage change in excess of 3% can be cumulatively reserved and can be added to the annual change in the CPI for years in which the CPI change is less than 3%. If the actual assessment rate for any given year is not increased by an amount equal to a minimum of 3% or the yearly CPI change plus any CPI change in previous years that was in excess of 3%, the maximum authorized assessment shall increase by this amount. In such event, the maximum authorized assessment shall be equal to the base year assessment as adjusted by the increase to the CPI, plus any and all CPI adjustments deferred in any and all prior years.

The increases in these assessments, according to the formula described above, was approved by a majority vote of the owners of the lots in Tract No. 5529 voting in a land owner ballot proceeding on the issue of the assessment conducted on August 6, 2007, in accordance with Article XIIID of the California Constitution and Section 53753 of the California Government Code.

Assessments in each successive year are subject to an annual adjustment tied to the Consumer Price Index-U for the San Francisco Bay Area as of December of each succeeding year (the "CPI"), with a maximum annual CPI adjustment not to exceed 3%. The calculation of the change in the CPI shall use December 2021 as the base year CPI.

The increases in these assessments, according to the formula described above, was approved by a majority vote of the owners of the lots in Tract No 6257, 6313, & 6314 voting in a land owner ballot proceeding on the issue of the assessment conducted on December 07, 2020, in accordance with Article XIIID of the California Constitution and Section 53753 of the California Government Code.

Adopt a resolution approving the City of Firebaugh FY 22/23 list of eligible projects for funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA) created by Senate Bill (SB) 1 Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, and authorizing the City Manager to file with the California Transportation Commission (CTC) the Project List and the Annual Expenditure Report for FY 22/23 RMRA Funding

BACKGROUND

Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and signed into law by the Governor on April 28, 2017, in order to address the transportation funding shortfalls statewide. The 2016 and 2018 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment show that a majority of the city streets and roads in California are at an "at-risk" condition and this funding will provide for improving the roads system. It is anticipated that over the next decade, SB 1 will contribute to restoring streets and roads into a "good" condition. SB 1 funding will be generated from increased gasoline and diesel fuel excise taxes and additional vehicle registration fees for California residents.

SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions to ensure the funding is used on a fiscal year basis for eligible transportation projects including, but not limited to, road maintenance and rehabilitation, safety projects, railroad grade separations, complete streets components, and traffic control devices. Funding recipients must prepare a list of eligible projects to receive funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account on a fiscal year basis with these funds appropriated in the City budget. This list must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement. Funding recipients will also be required to prepare annual reports to indicate expenditure levels and completion status for each proposed project on a fiscal year basis.

Cities and counties will receive an annual allocation, determined from a population formula, which will be distributed on a monthly basis. SB 1 mandates that this new RMRA funding must not be used to supplant the current level of General Fund expenditures for street improvements and will be subject to oversight by the State Controller as part of the accountability and transparency provisions.

DISCUSSION

This year's allocation corresponds to the sixth year of funding and the fifth consecutive full allocation since the program's inception. The funds were first made available to cities and counties during Fiscal Year 2017-2018 as a partial allocation from the regular fiscal year amount.

In order to receive the FY 22/23 SB 1 funding, the City of Firebaugh must submit to the California Transportation Commission by July 1, 2022, or as extended by the Commission, a list of eligible projects approved by resolution by the City Council and submitted electronically using the CTC-developed an online tool.

The City has determined a project list consisting of any new projects to be funded with the RMRA FY 22/23 allocation and previously proposed and adopted projects (re-listed) for the RMRA Program.

The City of Firebaugh's FY 22/23 allocation is estimated at \$185,229 per the Local Streets and Roads – Projected Revenues dated January 2022 and as published by the California City Finance website. It is recommended that these funds be appropriated for the following new or re-listed eligible projects:

- 1. 13th Street Rehabilitation (from O Street to Bridge over the San Joaquin River) Re-listed
- 2. 12th Street Rehabilitation (from Washoe Avenue to M Street) Re-listed
- 3. 2023 Slurry Seals (various streets: River Lane, Cardella, Indart, Deboer, Tucci, Grayson, Rebecchi and Enrico) New

The attached project list (Exhibit 1) provides more detail including the project description, location, estimated completion date, and useful life.

The City's FY 22/23 Budget will include the following revenue and expenditure items for the FY 22/23 SB 1 Allocation:

Revenue: Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account: \$185,229 Expenditure: Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Projects: \$185,229

FISCAL IMPACT

The expenditures for the FY 22/23 eligible projects are anticipated to be funded 100% from the City's Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account. The proposed project expenditures for FY 22/23 are anticipated to match the estimated revenue of \$185,229 for FY 22/23.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 22-24, as follows:

- 1. Approving the City of Firebaugh FY 22/23 List of eligible projects for funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account administered by the California Transportation Commission in partnership with the State Controller's office, and
- 2. Authorizing the City Manager to file with the California Transportation Commission the Project List and Annual Expenditure Report for FY 22/23 RMRA Funding.

WHEREAS, RMRA funding will be generated from increased gasoline and diesel fuel excise taxes and additional vehicle registration fees for California residents, cities and counties will receive an annual allocation, determined from a population formula, which will be distributed on a monthly basis; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions to ensure the funding is used on a fiscal year basis for eligible transportation projects including, but not limited to, road maintenance and rehabilitation, safety projects, railroad grade separations, complete streets components, and traffic control devices, this new RMRA funding must not be used to supplant the current level of General Fund expenditures for street improvements and will be subject to oversight by the State Controller's office; and

WHEREAS, funding recipients must prepare a list of eligible projects to receive funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account on a fiscal year basis and approved by resolution by the governing board. This list must include a description and location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City has ensured public input and developed the most high-priority and cost-effective projects to receive SB 1 revenues and that would meet the City's priorities for transportation investment: and

WHEREAS, the selected project list includes any new projects to be funded with the RMRA FY 22/23 allocation and previously proposed and adopted projects (re-listed) to reaffirm the public and the State the City's intent to fund these projects with Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues; and

WHEREAS, the City of Firebaugh's FY 2022/2023 allocation for RMRA funding is estimated at \$185,229 and the City intends to appropriate these funds on its FY 22/23 Budget.

WHEREAS, the City's FY 2022/2023 allocation will be designated to the new or re-listed eligible projects listed below and as shown on Exhibit 1:

- 1. 13th Street Rehabilitation (from O Street to Bridge over the San Joaquin River) Re-listed

WHEREAS, the City is required to submit to the California Transportation Commission by July 1, 2022, or as extended by the Commission, the FY 2022/2023 List of eligible projects and a resolution that shows these projects were approved to receive FY 22/23 SB 1 funds: and

WHEREAS, funding recipients must prepare an annual report to indicate expenditure levels and completion status for each proposed project on a fiscal year basis.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Firebaugh hereby:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct findings of the Firebaugh City Council.
- 2. The City Council hereby approves the above proposed FY 2022/2023 List for eligible projects to receive funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account.
